Deferred Divisions

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 223, the division on the motion moved by Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont) for the passage of Bill 390, An Act to proclaim Ukrainian Famine and Genocide (Holodomor) Memorial Day, which had been deferred at the sitting on Wednesday, 3 June 2010, was further deferred until the Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Gaudreault (Hull), together with Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly celebrate 110 years of the Russian presence on Québec soil;

THAT the National Assembly salute the bonds of friendship between the peoples of Russia and Québec, which transcend mere economic, cultural, or institutional considerations.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mrs. Beauchamp, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Parks, Mr. McKay (L'Assomption), and Mr. Grondin (Beauce-Nord), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark World Oceans Day, which will be observed on 8 June next;

Recognizing the gravity of the oil spill under way in the Gulf of Mexico, the National Assembly agrees that the current moratorium on the issuance of permits for oil and natural gas exploration in the estuary and the Gulf of St. Lawrence must allow reflection on the need to protect marine biodiversity in Ouébec;

THAT it recognize protected marine areas as being important tools for safeguarding Québec's marine environments; and

THAT the National Assembly note the holding in Rimouski, on 10 and 11 June next, of the first symposium on protected marine areas in Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.
