The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark Municipalities Week, held from 2 to 8 June 1996, which gives Quebeckers the opportunity to show their attachment to their respective living environments, and that it pay tribute to the 10,000 devoted elected municipal officers of the 1400 municipal councils of Québec.

By leave of the Assembly under Standing Order 84, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 244, Mr. Bélanger, Government House Leader, moved:

THAT the Committee on the Budget and Administration, in its examination of Bill 36, An Act to amend the Financial Administration Act and other legislative provisions, hold special consultations and public hearings on Thursday, 6 June 1996, and for this purpose hear the following:

- Commission d'accès à l'information, from 8.00 o'clock p.m. to 9.00 o'clock p.m.;
- Public Protector, from 9.00 o'clock p.m. to 10.00 o'clock p.m.;
- Commission des droits de la personne, from 10.00 o'clock p.m. to 11.00 o'clock p.m.;
- Association coopérative d'économie familiale du centre de Montréal together with the Fédération nationale de consommateurs du Québec, from 11.00 o'clock p.m. to midnight;

The presentation by each group shall last not more than twenty minutes and its exchange with the members of the Committee shall last not more than forty minutes, which time shall be shared equally among the Members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in Opposition;

The Minister of State for the Economy and Finance shall be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

The motion was carried.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Chevrette, Minister of Natural Resources, informed the Assembly that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor recommended to its consideration Bill 21, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Société de récupération, d'exploitation et de développement forestiers du Québec, and then moved —That this Bill do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 21 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mr. Bélanger, Government House Leader, Bill 21 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Labour and the Economy.

Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved, —That Bill 30, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Société d'habitation du Québec, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 30 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mr. Bélanger, Government House Leader, Bill 30 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures.

Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved, —That Bill 24, An Act to amend the Cities and Towns Act, the Municipal Code of Québec and other legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

And debate arising;

At 12.52 o'clock p.m., Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, having left the Chair, the proceedings were suspended until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.03 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

And debate continuing on the motion by Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, -That

Bill 24, An Act to amend the Cities and Towns Act, the Municipal Code of Québec and other legislative provisions, do now pass in principle;

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 24 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mrs. Caron, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 24 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures.

Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved, —That Bill 22, An Act to amend the Act respecting land use planning and development, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and Bill 22 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mrs. Caron, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 22 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures.

Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved, —That Bill 17, An Act to repeal the Act respecting the neighbourhood of Mont Sainte-Anne park, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 17 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mrs. Caron, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 17 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures.

Mr. Cliche, Minister of the Environment and Wildlife, moved, —That Bill 9, An Act to repeal the Act respecting the Conseil de la conservation et de l'environnement and to amend the Ecological Reserves Act, do now pass in principle.

And debate arising;

At 6.02 o'clock p.m., Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, having left the Chair, the proceedings were suspended until 8.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 8.03 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

And debate continuing on the motion by Mr. Cliche, Minister of the Environment and Wildlife, —That Bill 9, An Act to repeal the Act respecting the Conseil de la conservation et de l'environnement and to amend the Ecological Reserves Act, do now pass in principle;

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried on division and Bill 9 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mrs. Caron, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 9 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures.

Mr. Cliche, Minister of the Environment and Wildlife, moved, —That Bill 16, An Act to amend the Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 16 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mrs. Caron, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 16 was referred for

clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 132, An Act to amend the Act respecting beer and soft drink distributors' permits.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 133, An Act to amend the Charter of human rights and freedoms and other legislative provisions.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 7, An Act to amend the Code of Civil Procedure, the Act respecting the Régie du logement, the Jurors Act and other legislative provisions.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 5, An Act to amend the Mining Duties Act.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 51, An Act respecting the implementation of international trade agreements.

The report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 129, An Act to amend the Act respecting lotteries, publicity contests and amusement machines in respect of international cruise ships.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

At 12.00 o'clock a.m., Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, suspended the sitting.

President, was asked to withdraw from the Chamber for the remainder of the sitting.

And debate continuing on the motion by Mr. Rochon;

Pursuant to Standing Order 100, Mr. Williams (Nelligan) moved the adjournment of the debate.

The motion was carried.
