QUÉBEC

The Assembly was called to order at 10.11 o'clock a.m.

Moment of reflection

At the invitation of Mr. President, Mr. Bouchard, Prime Minister, introduced to the Assembly the new Member for L'Assomption, Mr. Jean-Claude Saint-André.

Mr. Bouchard, Mr. Johnson, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Dumont (Rivière-du-Loup) and Mr. Saint-André (L'Assomption) then took the floor.
