Introduction of Bills

Mrs. Marois, Minister of Education, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:

87 An Act respecting conditions governing the use of immovables of the Protestant School Board of Greater Montreal by the Commission des écoles catholiques de Montréal.

The motion was carried.

Mr. President communicated to the Assembly and then laid upon the Table the report from the Law Clerk on the following Private Bill:

²⁵⁰ An Act respecting Municipalité régionale de comté de Charlevoix-Est and Municipalité de la rivière Malbaie X This Bill may be introduced in the

Assembly but it may not receive final passage before the twenty-first day of December 1996.

Mr. Bertrand (Charlevoix) then moved that leave be granted to introduce Private Bill 250, An Act respecting Municipalité régionale de comté de Charlevoix-Est and Municipalité de la rivière Malbaie.

This motion was carried.

On motion by Mr. Bélanger, Government House Leader, Private Bill 250 was referred for consultations and clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures, of which the Minister of Municipal Affairs shall be a member during its deliberations in respect of the said Bill.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the divisions, which had been deferred at the sitting of 12 December 1996, on the report of the Committee on Institutions regarding Bill 130, An Act respecting administrative justice, and on the amendments moved by Mr. Bégin, Minister of Justice, and by Mr. Mulcair (Chomedey).

First, the question was put on the amendments by Mr. Bégin, Minister of Justice, to sections 1, 4, 5, 6, 6.1, 7, 92, 100, 109, 110, 113, 121, 121.4, 126.1, 130.1, 153.1 to 153.6, 187.1 and to appendices I to V of the French version of the Bill, as well as to sections 17, 20, 21, 22, 24, 26, 28, 33, 34, 49, 56, 70, 81, 103, 117, 118, 120, 136, 137, 141, 144, 146, 148, 149, 152, 166 and 181 of the English version of the Bill; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

These amendments were carried on the following vote:

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Brassard, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Léonard, Minister for Administration and the Public Service, Chairman of the Conseil du Trésor, moved the passage of Bill 73, An Act respecting the Commission administrative des

régimes de retraite et d=assurances and amending various legislative provisions as regards pension plans.

And debate arising;

During the debate, Mr. Léonard, Minister for Administration and the Public Service, Chairman of the Conseil du Trésor, moved that Bill 73 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for the consideration of an amendment that he specified.

This motion having been carried, Bill 73 was accordingly referred to a Committee of the Whole.

The said amendment to section 28 was considered and then carried in Committee of the Whole.

Bill 73, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the Committee's report.

And debate continuing on the motion for the passage of Bill 73;

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 73 was passed.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved, –That Bill 82, An Act to defer the general election of 1996 in Ville de La Baie, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 82 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mr. Brassard, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 82 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures.

Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved, –That Bill 83, An Act to amend the Cities and Towns Act, the Municipal Code of Québec and other legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 83 was accordingly passed in principle.

On motion by Mr. Brassard, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 83 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and Infrastructures.

Passage

Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved the passage of Bill 72, An Act to amend the constituent Acts of the urban communities and other legislative provisions.

And debate arising;

During the debate, Mr. Trudel, Minister of Municipal Affairs, moved that Bill 72 be referred to a Committee of the Whole for the consideration of amendments that he specified.

This motion having been carried, Bill 72 was accordingly referred to a Committee of the Whole.

The amendments handed in by Mr. Trudel to sections 34.1, 101.1, 102.1 and 103.1 of Bill 72 were considered and then carried in Committee of the Whole.

Bill 72, as amended, was reported to the Assembly, which concurred in the Committee's report.

And debate continuing on the motion for the passage of Bill 72;

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 72 was passed.
