- X the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 150, An Act respecting the Ministère de l=Emploi et de la Solidarité and establishing the Commission des partenaires du marché du travail, and of Bill 96, An Act to amend the Act respecting labour standards as regards the duration of a regular work week;

X the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 92, An Act respecting the Greater Montréal Development Commission.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 140, An Act to amend the Act respecting safety in sports.

The report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 112, An Act to amend the Act respecting elections and referendums in municipalities.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 252, Mrs. Caron, Deputy Government House Leader, moved an amendment to the report in order to include the following motion:

THAT the references contained in the sections of Bill 112, An Act to amend the Act respecting elections and referendums in municipalities, be amended in order to take into account the coming into force, on 1 May 1997, of the loose-leaf publication, updated as at 1 March 1996, of the Revised Statutes of Québec (Orderin-Council 568-97 of 30 April 1997).

The amendment was carried.

The report, as amended, was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 79, An Act to establish the Commission des lésions professionnelles and amending various legislative provisions, together with the amendments handed in by Mr. Beaudet (Argenteuil).

These amendments were declared in order.

After debate thereon, the amendments were negatived.

The report was concurred in.

Passage

Mr. Boisclair, Minister of Relations with the Citizens and Immigration, moved the passage of Bill 121, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Conseil permanent de la jeunesse and other legislative provisions.

The motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 121 was passed.

Passage in Principle

Resuming the debate on the motion by Mrs. Marois, Minister of Education, —That Bill 109, An Act to amend the Education Act, the Act respecting school elections and other legislative provisions, do now pass in principle;

On motion by Mr. Bélanger, Government House Leader, the debate was adjourned.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.
Passage

Mr. Bégin, Minister of Justice, moved the passage of Bill 106, An Act to amend the Press Act.

The motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 106 was passed.

THAT upon its resumption the debate on the passage in principle of Bill 109 be limited to one speech only, being that of the Minister of Education for her reply.
