The Assembly was called to order at 10.02 o'clock a.m.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Williams (Nelligan) moved:

THAT the National Assembly request that the Government convene a parliamentary committee for the purpose of hearing the interested parties with respect to the Government=s decision to retroactively claim tax contributions from tip employees.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Brouillet, Vice-President, announced the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: ten minutes shall be allotted for a reply by its mover and five minutes shall be set aside for each of the independent Members; the two parliamentary groups shall share equally the rest of the time allotted for this debate; within this framework, any time not used by a parliamentary group shall be added to that of the other group while any time not used by the independent Members may be redistributed amongst the parliamentary groups, and individual addresses shall not otherwise be limited.

And debate arising on the motion moved by Mr. Williams;

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Boulerice, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the present sitting day.

At 12.01 o'clock p.m., Mr. Brouillet, Vice-President, having left the Chair, the proceedings were suspended until 2.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 2.02 o'clock p.m.

- X the Committee on Institutions, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 181, An Act to amend the Civil Code and other legislative provisions as regards the publication of personal and movable real rights and the constitution of movable hypothecs without delivery.

Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- X the Committee on Labour and the Economy shall hold a deliberative meeting for the purpose of continuing the discussion initiated at a previous sitting;
- X the Committee on Public Administration shall examine the financial commitments of the Ministère des Transports contained in the lists for the months of February and March 1997 and those of the Public Protector contained in the lists for the months of January to March 1997.
