

The Assembly was called to order at 10.07 o'clock a.m.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Business Having Precedence

Estimates of Expenditure

The Assembly began a limited debate on the reports of the Committees that had considered the Estimates of Expenditure of the Ministries for the 1998-99 fiscal year.

Before the debate began, Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, following a meeting with the House Leaders of the parliamentary groups, announced the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: Five minutes shall be set aside for each of the independent Members; the two parliamentary groups shall share equally the rest of the time allotted for this debate; within this framework, any time not used by a parliamentary group or by the independent Members may be redistributed, and individual addresses shall not otherwise be limited.

And debate arising on the reports of the Committees that had considered the Estimates of Expenditure of the Ministries for the 1998-99 fiscal year;

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, the proceedings continued beyond 12.00 o=clock p.m.

The debate being concluded and the Assembly having disposed of the want of confidence motions and the motion by the Minister of Finance that was moved upon conclusion of the Budget Speech, the question was put on the several reports together of the Committees that had considered the Estimates of Expenditure of the Ministries for the 1998-99 fiscal year; recorded divisions were thereupon demanded on these several reports together as well as on the consequent appropriation bill.

At the request of Mr. Boulerice, Deputy Government House Leader, the divisions were deferred until Routine Proceedings on the present sitting day.

At 12.12 o'clock p.m., Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, having left the Chair, the proceedings were suspended until 2.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 2.04 o'clock p.m.

Mr. President communicated to the Assembly and then tabled the following:

Introduction of Bills

Mr. Ménard, Minister of Justice, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill: 432 An Act to amend article 21 of the Civil Code and other legislative provisions.

271 An Act to replace the Charter of the city of Sainte-Foy X This Bill may be introduced in the Assembly and it may receive final passage before the twenty-third day of June 1998.

THAT a period of sixty minutes shall be allotted for the opening statements, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in Opposition;

The presentation by each individual shall not last more than twenty minutes and the exchange with the members of the committee shall not last more than forty minutes, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in Opposition;

The presentation by each group shall not last more than thirty minutes and its exchange with the members of the committee shall not last more than sixty minutes, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in Opposition;

The Minister for Canadian Intergovernmental Affairs shall be a member of the committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference;

Furthermore, the Minister of Education, the Minister of State for the Economy and Finance, and the Minister of State for Employment and Solidarity shall also be members of the said committee with respect to this order of reference;

THAT all briefs by individuals and groups be submitted to the Secrétariat des commissions by Thursday, 28 May 1998.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Pinard, Vice-President, announced the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: five minutes shall be allotted for a reply by its mover and five minutes shall be set aside for the independent Members; the two parliamentary groups shall share equally the rest of the time allotted for this debate; within this framework, any time not used by a parliamentary group shall be added to that of the other group while any time not used by the independent Members may be redistributed amongst the parliamentary groups, and individual addresses shall not otherwise be limited.

And debate arising on the motion moved by Mr. Brassard;

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Brassard, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Rochon, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved, —That Bill 404, An Act to amend the Act respecting health services and social services and amending various legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and Bill 404 was accordingly passed

in principle.

On motion by Mr. Brassard, Deputy Government House Leader, Bill 404 was referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Social Affairs.

At 6.01 o'clock p.m., Mr. Brouillet, Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 14 May 1998, at 10.00 o'clock a.m.
