> THAT the National Assembly reiterate its position of 18 October 2006, 31 March 2009 and 4 November 2009, by demanding that the Canadian Firearms Registry be maintained in its entirety, including the registration of hunting weapons, and urge the Federal Members to vote in favour of the motion submitted to the House of Commons by the Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security in order to discontinue the examination of Bill C-391, An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Firearms Act (repeal of long-gun registry).

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Bédard (Chicoutimi) moved:

THAT the National Assembly direct the Committee on Institutions to shed light on the inconsistency between the testimony by Me Denis Roy of the Premier's office before the Attorney General of Québec in the Hell's Angels mega-trial and the answer given by the Premier in the National Assembly on 23 October 2003:

"... and if he is asking us whether or not I intervened, if I took action, or anyone from my office, concerning any matter that is before the courts, the answer, of course, is no";

THAT it hear all persons it shall deem necessary, particularly the Premier, Mr. Stéphane Bouchard, Me Denis Roy and Me Marc Bellemare.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply, 5 minutes shall be allotted to the Member for Mercier; 1 minute and 37 seconds shall be allotted to each of the other independent Members; 7 minutes and 42 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; the remaining time shall be shared equally among the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, that is, 47 minutes for each of the two parliamentary groups; within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members of by the Members of the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.
