Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Normandeau, Minister responsible for Canadian Intergovernmental Affairs and the Canadian Francophonie, together with Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

> To meet basic requirements in terms of socioeconomic data, that the National Assembly ask the Federal Government to reconsider its decision to eliminate the manditory Census of Population long-form and call upon it to ensure that this questionnaire continue to be used.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, Mrs. Normandeau, Minister responsible for Canadian Intergovernmental Affairs and the Canadian Francophonie, tabled the following:

Copy of a letter, dated 16 July 2010, addressed to Mr. Tony Clement, Minister of Industry and Minister responsible for Statistics Canada, signed by Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, concerning the population census scheduled for May 2011; (Sessional Paper No. 1583-20100928)

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 29 September 2010, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate will be held on the motion by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly demand that Hydro-Québec release as expeditiously as possible the information relating to all contracts granted from 2004 to 2010, particularly the names of the companies that submitted tenders, the method of awarding contracts, the amount of each bid, as well as the actual amount of disbursements, including cost overrun, for each contract granted, and that this motion become an order of the Assembly.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Labour and the Economy on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 111, An Act to amend the Act respecting labour standards in order to facilitate reciprocal enforcement of decisions ordering the payment of a sum of money. After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Simard, Minister for Natural Resources and Wildlife, moved, –That Bill 79, An Act to amend the Mining Act, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 7.30 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion by Mr. Simard, Minister for Natural Resources and Wildlife, for the passage in principle of Bill 79, An Act to amend the Mining Act.

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mr. Khadir (Mercier) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

The debate continued.

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Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Wednesday, 29 September 2010, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.
