This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec demand that the Government of Canada immediately suspend the authorization to conduct seismic surveys in the Gulf of St. Lawrence granted on 4 October 2010 by the Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Petroleum Board;

THAT it demand that the Government of Québec take all of the necessary measures, including legal recourse, in order that this authorization be suspended and that Québec's natural resources found in the Gulf of St. Lawrence be kept from all development by the province of Newfoundland and Labrador.
