

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bédard, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Mr. Simard, Minister responsible for the Saguenay–Lac-Saint-Jean region, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Mr. Cloutier (Lac-Saint-Jean), Mr. Trottier (Roberval), Mr. Grondin (Beauce-Nord), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly officially support the proposal to inscribe the Fjord du Saguenay site on Canada's Tentative List for 2014, in anticipation of a recognition as a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its outstanding and unique qualities.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 40 years of Québec's public health insurance plan;

THAT it reiterate the importance of the *Health Insurance Act* which, on 1 November 1970, established the foundation of a system that is still in place today, a public health system that is free, accessible and universal for all Quebecers.

- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 48, Code of ethics and conduct of the Members of the National Assembly.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mrs. Maltais (Taschereau) moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec recognize the Liberal Government's failure to meet the target of 12 hours or less as the average time spent on a stretcher in the emergency ward set forth in the 2005-2010 strategic plan of the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux and that it demand that the current average time spent on a stretcher be reduced by 40 % by 1 September 2011.

Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply, 5 minutes shall be allotted to the Member for Mercier; 1 minute and 37 seconds shall be allotted to each of the other independent Members; 7 minutes and 42 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; the remaining time shall be shared equally among the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members of the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, that is, 47 minutes for each of the two parliamentary groups; within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members of by the Members of the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

During his address, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Villeneuve (Berthier) tabled the following:
