Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 10 November 2010 and again deferred at the sitting of 11 November 2010, on the motion moved by Mr. McKay (L'Assomption) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec demand that a moratorium on shale gas exploration and extraction be immediately decreed until the entry into force of new legislative and regulatory provisions aiming to ensure a development of these activities that is safe for both the environment and public health.

THAT the National Assembly of Québec demand the holding of a public and independent inquiry into the construction industry as a whole, the awarding of public contracts, licenses and grants as well as the financing of political parties. At 3.13 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

The proceedings resumed at 3.20 o'clock p.m.

Mr. President heard arguments on a matter of privilege or contempt raised by Mr. Bédard, Official Opposition House Leader, on 11 November 2010, concerning the motion carried unanimously by the Assembly on 29 September 2010 and referring to the production of documents by Hydro-Québec.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Bédard, Official Opposition House Leader, tabled the following:

An exchange of letters between Mrs. Marie-José Nadeau, responsible for access to documents at Hydro-Québec, and Mrs. Sandra Boucher, political advisor, concerning a request for access to documents regarding a list of contracts that were granted.
