#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, together with Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and that it commend the involvement of AFEAS for Opération Tendre la main.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), together with Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly affirm that polygamy is not a fundamental value of Québec society;

THAT it deem this practice contrary to the right to equality between women and men, and that it commend the position expressed to this effect by the Conseil du statut de la femme.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mrs. Ouellet (Vachon), together with Mr. Arcand, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Parks, Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly support the order issued by the House of Commons yesterday to produce a copy of the aqueduct system analysis reports for Valcartier military base, from 1970 on.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 124, An Act to amend various pension plans in the public sector; to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 123, An Act respecting the amalgamation of the Société générale de financement du Québec and Investissement Québec;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 122, An Act to amend the Building Act mainly to modernize safety standards;
- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 126, An Act to tighten the regulation of educational childcare.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he convened the following Committees:

— the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 113, An Act to put a stop to election contributions in the name of another; to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 114, An Act to increase the powers of oversight of the Chief Electoral Officer; and to continue its public hearings within the framework of a general consultation on Bill 94, An Act to establish guidelines governing accommodation requests within the Administration and certain institutions;

- the Committee on Public Finance, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 128, An Act to enact the Money-Services Businesses Act and to amend various legislative provisions mainly concerning special funds and the financial sector;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 131, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Régie du logement and various Acts concerning municipal affairs.

Mr. Chagnon, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Public Finance shall hold a deliberative meeting for the purpose of discussing a request for an order of initiative concerning tobacco smuggling.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he gave the following notices:

- the Select Committee on Dying with Dignity shall continue its public hearings within the framework of a general consultation;
- the Committee on Culture and Education shall hold a deliberative meeting within the framework of the examination of petitions on sex education classes; and it shall hold a public meeting to hear the persons and agencies.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage

Mr. Lessard, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy, moved the passage of Bill 109, Municipal Ethics and Good Conduct Act.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Bachand, Minister of Revenue, moved, —That Bill 117, An Act giving effect to the Budget Speech delivered on 30 March 2010 and to certain other budget statements, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried on division and Bill 117 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 117 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Public Finance.

The motion was carried.
