Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Culture and Education, which, on 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 23, 24, 25, 27 August and on 7 September 2010, heard the head officers of universities in application of the *Act respecting educational institutions at the university level*. The Committee also held deliberative meetings on 27 October 2009, 16 August, 7 September and 8 December 2010. This report contains 10 recommendations.

Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 5 minutes shall be allotted to the Member for Mercier; 1 minute and 45 seconds shall be allotted to each of the remaining independent Members; 8 minutes and 30 seconds shall be allotted to the Members of the Second Opposition Group, while the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition shall share equally the remaining time set aside for this debate. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by the Members of the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.
