ORDERS OF THE DAY

BUSINESS HAVING PRECEDENCE

(1) Pursuant to Standing Orders 275 and 276, continuation of the debate on the motion by the Minister of Finance, - That this Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government,

And on the motions stating a grievance moved by:

The Member for Mercier:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its 2010-2011 budget, which, in order to re-establish fiscal balance, reduces accessibility to and compromises the quality of public services, particularly by reducing accessibility to university studies, by delaying the development of reduced-contribution child care services and by refusing to get the necessary revenue from businesses and individuals having the means to provide it.

The Leader of the Official Opposition:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its 2011-2012 budget, which broke the moral contract it had with Québec's population as regards the shared effort to re-establish fiscal balance.

The Member for Marguerite-D'Youville:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for having failed to provide real solutions to assist students with adjustment and learning difficulties in its 2011-2012 budget.

The Member for Hochelaga-Maisonneuve:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for haven broken its promise to create 15,000 new child care places for young Québec families.

The Member for L'Assomption:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for its lack of rigour in managing Québec's natural resources.

The Member for Verchères:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Liberal Government for not having taken measures to efficiently fight collusion and corruption, particularly, first and foremost, by initiating a commission of inquiry into the construction industry, the granting of contracts, permits, subsidies and the funding of political parties.

(2) Resuming the debate, adjourned in the name of the Member for Beauharnois 31 March 2011, on the motion by the Premier, —That this Assembly approves the general policy of the Government,

And on the motions stating a grievance moved by:

The Leader of the Official Opposition:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government and its Premier for their lack of vision and realism as regards Quebecers' expectations in the Opening Speech, particularly demonstrated by their incapacity to control the rising debt, their refusal to impose a moratorium on shale gas exploration and development, as well as their obstinate refusal to launch a public and independent inquiry on the construction industry, on the granting of public contracts, permits and subsidies, as well as on the financing of political parties.

The Member for Mercier:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Government for refusing to accept the legitimate requests from the majority of the population concerning the creation of a public inquiry committee on the connections between the financing of political parties and the granting of Government contracts, the establishment of a moratorium on shale gas and

the cancellation of the rate policies set forth in the 2010 budget that concern middle class and low-income individuals.

The Member for Rousseau:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government in office, which alone is responsible for one quarter of the Québec Government's accumulated debt.

The Member for Jonquière:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for its incoherence and lack of vision in managing our energy resources.

The Member for Drummond:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for refusing to ensure the primacy of the French language and culture as an international outreach tool, a harmonious integration resource for immigrants and an expression of the national pride of Quebecers.

The Member for Crémazie:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for its misconduct with regard to vulnerable seniors and for its obstinate refusal to immediately implement an emergency plan to handle the crisis that is prevailing with respect to seniors' services and security.

The Member for Nicolet-Yamaska:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for refusing to recognize that Québec sovereignty, to wit, the control of all of its taxes, the voting on all of its laws and the signing of all of its treaties, is an essential condition to Québec's full economic development.

The Member for Bourget:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government and its Premier for their lack of vision and desire for a true integration of all of our immigrants into Québec society.

The Member for Marguerite-D'Youville:

THAT the National Assembly severely blame the Liberal Government for its lack of understanding as regards the true needs of the education sector.

To the Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports:

Further to the sitting of 22 March, during which one quarter of the estimates of expenditure of your ministry were examined and adopted, we would like you to provide us with the exact amount of administrative expenses attributable to the operations costs of the school board network. Would the Minister also confirm the data contained in the report tabled on 12 May 2010 by the Auditor General of Québec on this subject? This report made a comparison of the administrative expenses incurred by five different school boards within eight budgetary items.

(2) Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) – **29 March 2011**To the Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports:

At the sitting of 22 March, when the estimates of expenditure of your ministry were examined and adopted, you stated that you intended to reduce the bureaucratic weight of your organization

Could you provide us with details regarding the sectors concerned by this approach, the expected savings and the implementation schedule? It is our understanding that this evaluation will cover the central organization of your ministry, as well as all of the entities forming the education network in Québec, including school boards. We expect to receive the clearly quantified objectives of this approach, more particularly in dollars and percentages.
