By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bergman (D'Arcy-McGee), together with Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford) and Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognizes that Monday, 2 May 2011, was Yom Hashoah, the International Day of Commemoration for the Victims of the Holocaust.

THAT the National Assembly strongly condemn the terrorist attack that took place on 28 April 2011 at a café in Marrakech, Morocco, causing the death of 16 persons and injuring 21 others, and offer its sincere condolences to the families and their loved ones affected by this tragedy.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, Mr. Blanchet (Drummond) and Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark World Press Freedom Day;

THAT it reiterate the fundamental and democratic nature of a free and independent press;

THAT it commend, by extension, the outstanding work carried out every day by thousands of Ouébec journalists.

- the Committee on Labour and the Economy shall hold a deliberative meeting to examine the progress reports received within the framework of the examination of petitions tabled by the Member for Beauharnois, respecting the abolition of certain penalties concerning accident victims and victims of work-related diseases and the request to abolish the Bureau d'évaluation médicale.

Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 4 May 2011, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate will be held on the motion by Mr. Bergeron (Verchères).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Minister of Public Security mandate the anti-corruption commissioner to investigate the allegations of irregularities committed within the framework of the administration of the city of Laval, following the example of the mandate given regarding the management of the city of Montréal.

Estimates of Expenditure

Estimates of the National Assembly

On the motion by Mr. Dutil, Deputy Government House Leader, and pursuant to Standing Order 286, the Assembly resolved itself into a committee of the whole to consider the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly for the 2011-2012 fiscal year.

After a meeting held with the House leaders of the parliamentary groups in pursuance of Standing Order 285, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, Chair of the Committee of the Whole, informed the committee that the period allotted for the consideration of the estimates shall not exceed two hours and that the speaking time shall be apportioned as follows: 20 minutes shall be allotted to the President for his opening remarks; thereafter, 50 per cent of the time shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 38 per cent of the time shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; seven per cent of the time shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and two minutes shall be reserved for each of the independent Members.

The Committee of the Whole entered upon the consideration of the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly.

The consideration of the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly being concluded, Mr. Reid (Orford), member of the Committee of the Whole, reported to the Assembly.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mrs. Courchesne, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved, —That Bill 133, An Act respecting the governance and management of the information resources of public bodies and government enterprises, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

Debates Upon Adjournment

At 5.58 o'clock p.m., by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 309, the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question by Mr. Bérubé (Matane) addressed to Mr. Simard, Minister for Natural Resources and Wildlife, about the ZEC Wessonneau.

At 6.11 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

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Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The debate continued on the motion by Mrs. Courchesne, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, for the passage in principle of Bill 133, An Act respecting the governance and management of the information resources of public bodies and government enterprises.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 133 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Paquet, Minister for Finance, moved that Bill 133 be referred for clause-byclause consideration to the Committee on Public Finance.

The motion was carried.

Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, informed the Assembly that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor recommended to its consideration Bill 82, Cultural Heritage Act, and then moved, —That this Bill do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Blanchet (Drummond).
