# **ORDERS OF THE DAY**

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

Mr. Bachand, Minister of Revenue, informed the Assembly that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor recommended to its consideration Bill 6, Unclaimed Property Act, and then moved, –That this Bill do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 6 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, moved that Bill 6 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Public Finance.

The motion was carried.

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 7 April 2011, on the motion by Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, for the passage in principle of Bill 127, An Act to improve the management of the health and social services network.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion by Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, for the passage in principle of Bill 127, An Act to improve the management of the health and social services network.

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mr. Traversy (Terrebonne) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

The debate continued.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 127 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved that Bill 127 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Health and Social Services.

The motion was carried.

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 4 May 2011, on the motion by Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, for the passage in principle of Bill 82, Cultural Heritage Act.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 82 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved that Bill 82 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Culture and Education.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Tuesday, 10 May 2011, at 1.45 o'clock p.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 3.43 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 10 May 2011, at 1.45 o'clock p.m.
