Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Fournier, Minister of Justice, together with Mrs. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 8th edition of the International Day Against Homophobia, whose theme is "Sexual diversity in the workplace, it pays off!";

THAT, on this occasion, the National Assembly reaffirm its will to remove all obstacles to the full recognition of the social equality of gay, lesbian, bisexual, transexual and transgender communities and that it salute all of the organizations that contribute to defeating homophobia in Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Curzi (Borduas), together with Mrs. St-Pierre, Minister of Culture, Communications and the Status of Women, Mr. Kotto (Bourget), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec mark World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development that came shortly before the adoption, in October 2005, of the Convention on the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions, which Québec was the first to sign;

THAT it renew its commitment to this diversity and pledge to promote and defend it in all of the bilateral and multilateral agreements to which it will directly or indirectly be a signatory.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 57, An Act to modify the rules governing the use of photo radar devices and red light camera systems and amend other legislative provisions;
- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its public hearings within the framework of a general consultation on the green paper for an agrifood policy entitled "Donner le goût du Québec"; and to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 27, An Act respecting the Société du Plan Nord;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 69, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs;

— the Committee on Institutions, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 64, An Act to promote access to justice in family matters.

Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Friday, 25 May 2012, Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska) would question Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, during an interpellation on "the economic costs for Québec as a province of Canada.".
