Mr. President gave the following directive on the *sub judice* rule:

DIRECTIVE FROM THE CHAIR

Members must observe the sub judice rule provided for in Standing Order 35. This rule stipulates that no Member speaking may refer to any matter that is under adjudication before a court of law where such reference may be prejudicial to the interests of any person or party. This rule, which is applied in deference to the separation of powers and the integrity of the judicial process, applies during the period for appeal.

In criminal and penal matters, the *sub judice* rule must be strictly applied, as prejudice is assumed. Members of the Assembly are forbidden to refer, even indirectly, to a matter that is before the courts.

The Chair has already allowed a Minister to answer a question concerning the Government's behaviour in a given situation and not the trial as such. However, considering that in the present case a ruling restricts the publishing of certain elements, the Chair cannot determine, among the exchanges that could take place, what could be prejudicial to the parties involved. Consequently, the *sub judice* rule must be strictly applied and all Members must refrain from asking questions or answering in a manner that, even indirectly, could have an impact on a criminal matter.

Oral Questions and Answers

THAT the National Assembly underline the winners and finalists of the Prix reconnaissance de l'Alliance des cadres de l'État awarded last 13 May. These awards aim to promote the excellence of State managerial staff and to formally recognize the achievements of those who distinguish themselves by their professionalism, creativity and innovative practices;

THAT it also congratulate the winners and finalists of the Mérite APSSAP 2011 announced last 27 April at the Gala whose purpose is to underline the efforts and initiatives of health and safety workers who, each day, strive to make their work environment a healthier and safer place.
