Report Stage

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in on division.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 130, An Act to abolish the Ministère des Services gouvernementaux and the Société québécoise de récupération et de recyclage and to implement the Government's 2010-2014 Action Plan to Reduce and Control Expenditures by abolishing or restructuring certain bodies and certain funds.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

#### Passage

Mr. Hamad, Minister of Transport, moved the passage of Bill 2, An Act respecting the construction of a section of Highway 73 from Beauceville to Saint-Georges.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Dutil, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.
