Government Motions

The Assembly held the debate on the motion arising out of the tabling by Mrs. Gagnon-Tremblay, Minister of International Relations, on 24 February 2011, of the Reciprocal Agreement between the Government of Québec and the Republic of Austria, concerning the Recognition of Driver's Licences.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT, pursuant to section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, the National Assembly concur in the Reciprocal Agreement between the Government of Québec and the Republic of Austria concerning the Recognition of Driver's Licences.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: five minutes shall be set aside for the Member for Mercier; one minute 45 seconds shall be allocated to each of the other independent Members; eight minutes 30 seconds shall be allocated to the Members from the Second Opposition Group; the remaining time shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework any time not used by the independent Members or by the Members from the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried. Accordingly, this commitment was approved.
