Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Fournier, Minister of Justice, moved, —That Bill 25, An Act to prohibit the resale of tickets at a price above that announced by the authorized vendor, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 25 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, moved that Bill 25 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Citizen Relations.

Mr. Simard, Minister for Natural Resources and Wildlife, moved, —That Bill 14, An Act respecting the development of mineral resources in keeping with the principles of sustainable development, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

The motion was carried.
