By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 145, Mr. Dutil, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 22, An Act to amend the Civil Code as regards the resiliation of a dwelling lease in certain cases.

Motions Without Notice

Mrs. Hivon (Joliette) moved a motion concerning the death of Rebecca Lévesque; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford), together with Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), Mr. Gauvreau (Groulx), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska) and Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), moved a motion concerning Bill 191, An Act to amend the Auditor General Act; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, Mrs. Roy, Second Opposition Group House Leader, Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska) and Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly, in a spirit of cooperation, reaffirm that the independent Members have the right to jointly move a motion without notice with its mover, to propose modifications with regard to the wording, to give their consent or refuse to do so, just like any other Member.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Vien, Minister for Social Services, together with Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec, following the death of young 15-year-old Rebecca Lévesque in a youth centre, take note of the steps taken by the Minister for Social Services to follow up on the recommendations contained in the coroner's report;

And that it ask that the appropriate measures be taken.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Dutil, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the examination of Bill 23, An Act to amend various pension plans in the public sector, the Committee on Public Finance hold special consultations and public hearings on 4 and 5 October 2011, and that, for this purpose, it hear the following groups:

Association québécoise des retraités des secteurs public et parapublic

Secrétariat intersyndical des services publics

Confédération des syndicats nationaux

Fédération des travailleurs et travailleuses du Québec

A period of 15 minutes shall be allotted for the opening statements, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

The presentation by each group shall last no more than 15 minutes and the exchange with the members of the Committee shall last no more than 45 minutes, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

A period of 15 minutes shall be allotted for the closing statements, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

The Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor shall be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Dutil, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committee:

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 28 September 2011, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate will be held on the motion by Mr. Drainville (Marie-Victorin).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly authorize the Auditor General of Québec to freely conduct, without any other authorization, a value-for-money audit of Hydro-Québec.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Statutory Debates

The Assembly entered upon the debate on the report of the Commission de la représentation électorale on the electoral boundaries of Québec, pursuant to section 28 of the *Election Act*, tabled in the Assembly by Mr. President on 20 September 2011.

Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 21 minutes shall be allotted to the Members of the Second Opposition Group; 20 minutes shall be granted to the independent Members; the rest of the time set aside for this debate shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by the Members of the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

Debates Upon Adjournment

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held two debates upon adjournment:

- the first, on a question by Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean) to Mr. Dutil, Minister of Public Security, about the flood victims of the Montérégie region;
- the second, on a question by Mr. McKay (L'Assomption) to Mr. Arcand, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Parks, about water.

At 6.27 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.
