Oral Questions and Answers

At the request of Mr. President, Mr. Bédard, Official Opposition House Leader, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

Mrs. Roy (Lotbinière) moved a motion concerning the Ministère des Transports; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Charest, Premier, together with Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie) and Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly, on the occasion of Remembrance Day, honour the women and men who gave their lives to maintain peace and defend freedom;

THAT it observe a moment of reflection in their memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the invitation of Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Curzi (Borduas), together with Mrs. Malavoy (Taillon), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska) and Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), moved a motion concerning tuition fees; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 30, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 120, An Act respecting political party leadership campaigns.
