Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Vallières, Minister responsible for the Reform of Democratic Institutions and Access to Information, and Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec underline the 35 years since the election of the first sovereignist government of the Parti Québécois, on 15 November 1976.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mrs. Léger, Chief Opposition Whip, together with Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, and Mr. Deltell, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec mark the 35 years since the election of the Member for Abitibi-Ouest.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Hamad, Minister of Economic Development, Innovation and Export Trade, together with Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford), Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière) and Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), moved:

THAT the National Assembly pay tribute to Les Conseillers Trigone, winner of the Grands Prix québécois de la qualité 2011.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford), together with Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, Mr. Marceau (Rousseau), Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), Mr. Gauvreau (Groulx), Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska) and Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the working language in Québec is French and that all administrators of public organizations must be able to communicate in French within the framework of their duties. Accordingly, that it invite the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec to take all necessary measures to ensure that all of its administrators express themselves in French in Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska), together with Mr. Curzi (Borduas) and Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), moved a motion concerning free education; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Dutil, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 21, An Act to amend the Act respecting the marketing of agricultural, food and fish products, and of Bill 14, An Act respecting the development of mineral resources in keeping with the principles of sustainable development;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 33, An Act to eliminate union placement and improve the operation of the construction industry;
- the Committee on Citizen Relations, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 24, An Act mainly to combat consumer debt overload and modernize consumer credit rules;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 7, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning the financial sector.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 16 November 2011, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate will be held on the motion by Mr. Blanchet (Drummond).

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Health and Social Services on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 16, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning health and social services in order, in particular, to tighten up the certification process for residences for the elderly.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

Passage in Principle

Mrs. Blais, Minister responsible for Seniors, moved, –That Bill 22, An Act to amend the Civil Code as regards the resiliation of a dwelling lease in certain cases, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 22 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Dutil, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 22 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain.

The motion was carried.

At 5.09 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Dutil, Deputy Government House Leader, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

Debates Upon Adjournment

At 6.02 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question by Mrs. Malavoy (Taillon) addressed to Mrs. Beauchamp, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, about the purchasing of student federation domain names on the Internet by the Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport.

Mrs. Beauchamp, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Wednesday, 16 November 2011, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.
