

#### **Oral Questions and Answers**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. St-Arnaud (Chambly) tabled the following:

At the request of Mr. President, Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford), together with Mr. Bédard (Chicoutimi), Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), Mr. Charette (Deux-Montagnes), Mr. Gauvreau (Groulx), Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the importance of Patrouille Secours emergency unit, which, over the past ten years, has carried out over 3500 emergency interventions on Highway 175 crossing Laurentides Park;

THAT it recall that this park has not had a Sûreté du Québec station since 1997 and that, consequently, firemen and policemen must travel from as far away as Québec City and Saguenay when an accident happens on this very busy highway;

THAT the National Assembly advocate maintaining a permanent emergency unit in order to ensure the protection of motorists circulating on Highway 175.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mrs. Beaudoin (Rosemont), together with Mr. Dufour (René-Lévesque), Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion concerning Bill 399, An Act to modernize the provisions relating to strikebreakers and to again amend the Labour Code; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 40, An Act to repeal the Act to ensure the continuity of the provision of legal services within the Government and certain public bodies and to amend the Act respecting the collective bargaining plan of criminal and penal prosecuting attorneys;
- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 27, An Act respecting the Société du Plan Nord, and of Bill 14, An Act respecting the development of mineral resources in keeping with the principles of sustainable development;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy, to conclude its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 35, An Act to prevent, combat and punish certain fraudulent practices in the construction industry and make other amendments to the Building Act; and to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 33, An Act to eliminate union placement and improve the operation of the construction industry;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 42, An Act to amend the Supplemental Pension Plans Act in order to extend certain measures to reduce the effects of the 2008 financial crisis on plans covered by the Act.

Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Culture and Education shall hold a deliberative meeting for the purpose of organizing its proceedings.

#### ORDERS OF THE DAY

#### **Debates on Reports from Committees**

The Assembly took into consideration the report of the Committee on Labour and the Economy, which, on 1 and 2 February 2011, held public hearings during special consultations within the framework of an order of initiative on the updating of the Labour Code's anti-scab provisions; the Committee also held deliberative meetings on 8 December 2010, on 1 and 2 February, 16 March, 20 October and 1 November 2011, in relation to this order. The report contains one recommendation.

Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 8 minutes and 24 seconds shall be allotted to the Members of the Second Opposition Group; 10 minutes shall be granted to the independent Members; the rest of the time set aside for this debate shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by the Members of the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

#### **Government Bills**

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 22, An Act to amend the Civil Code as regards the resiliation of a dwelling lease in certain cases.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Consequently, in pursuance of Standing Order 97, the debate on the consideration of the report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain was adjourned in the name of Mrs. Poirier (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve).

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

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#### **Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition**

Mrs. Hivon (Joliette) moved:

THAT the National Assembly call on the Government of Québec to take steps to enable Québec to have its own criminal laws, including the Criminal Code, that will reflect the fundamental values of Quebecers.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for her reply; 7 minutes 42 seconds shall be allotted to the Members of the Second Opposition Group; 10 minutes shall be granted to the independent Members; the rest of the time set aside for this debate shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by the Members of the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

#### **23 November 2011**

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
