#### ORDERS OF THE DAY

#### **Government Bills**

Passage

Mrs. Thériault, Minister of Labour, moved the passage of Bill 33, An Act to eliminate union placement and improve the operation of the construction industry.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

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Mr. Fournier, Minister of Justice and Attorney General, moved the passage of Bill 40, An Act to repeal the Act to ensure the continuity of the provision of legal services within the Government and certain public bodies and to amend the Act respecting the collective bargaining plan of criminal and penal prosecuting attorneys.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 40 was passed.

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Friday, 2 December 2011, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.
