Business Having Precedence

Want of Confidence Motion

Mr. Girard (Gouin) moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec withdraw its confidence in the Liberal Government and in its Chair of the Conseil du trésor and former Minister of Families based on the facts presented in the Auditor General's report concerning their political interventions in the allocation of childcare spaces.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 15 minutes shall be allotted for a reply by its mover; 5 minutes 15 seconds shall be allotted to the Members of the Second Opposition Group; 6 minutes 30 seconds shall be allotted to the independent Members; the rest of the time set aside for this debate shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by the Members of the Second Opposition Group shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose on the motion by Mr. Girard (Gouin).

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mr. Bonnardel (Shefford) twice withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mrs. James, Minister of Families, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

At the request of Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, Mrs. Bouillé (Iberville) twice withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Government Bills

Passage

Mrs. Thériault, Minister of Labour, moved the passage of Bill 35, An Act to prevent, combat and punish certain fraudulent practices in the construction industry and make other amendments to the Building Act.

At the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 32, An Act giving effect to the Budget Speech delivered on 17 March 2011 and to certain other budget statements and enacting the Act respecting the sectoral parameters of certain fiscal measures.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in on division.

Passage

Mr. Lessard, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy, moved the passage of Bill 30, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 30 was passed.

Mr. Bolduc, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved the passage of Bill 41, An Act to amend the Pharmacy Act.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Thursday, 8 December 2011, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.
