The presentation by each group shall last no more than 15 minutes and the exchange with the members of the Committee shall last no more than 45 minutes, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

A period of 15 minutes shall be allotted for the closing statements, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

The Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports shall be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

The motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 27, An Act respecting the Société du Plan Nord;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 46, An Act respecting independent police investigations;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 34, An Act to ensure the occupancy and vitality of territories.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, moved the passage of Bill 54, An Act respecting the sectoral parameters of certain fiscal measures.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 54 was passed.

Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Culture and Education, which, on 7 February 2012, examined the 2009-2012 strategic plan, policy directions, activities and administrative management of the Société de télédiffusion du Québec. This report contains one recommendation.

Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 17 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members; the rest of the time set aside for this debate shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

At 12.37 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Paquet, Minister for Finance, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 12.45 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 12.45 o'clock p.m.

Debates Upon Adjournment

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 309, the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment that had been deferred at the sitting of 28 February 2012, on a question by Mrs. Doyer (Matapédia) addressed to Mrs. Vien, Minister for Social Services, about services provided to disabled persons.
