# AGREEMENT FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDING ON THE PROVISION OF POLICING SERVICES 2011-2013

#### **AMONG**

The KATIVIK REGIONAL GOVERNMENT represented by its Chairperson and by its Secretary (hereinafter referred to as the « KRG »)

#### **AND**

THE GOUVERNEMENT DU QUÉBEC
represented by the ministre de la Sécurité publique and the ministre
responsable des Affaires autochtones
(hereinafter referred to as « Québec »)

WHEREAS the KRG, a legal person established in the public interest pursuant to the *Act respecting Northern Villages and the Kativik Regional Government* (R.S.Q., c. V-6.1) (hereinafter referred to as the "Kativik Act"), Canada and Quebec agree on the importance of the delivery of professional policing services in the territory of the Kativik Region as defined in section 2 (v) of the Kativik Act, in accordance with the *James Bay and Northern Québec Agreement*, applicable agreements, statutes and regulations, and the respective jurisdictions of each of the Parties;

WHEREAS the Parties recognize that the members of the Kativik Regional Police Force (KRPF) must possess the basic police patrolling skills as well as investigation and management skills to deliver effective policing services and ensure security in territory of the Kativik Region;

WHEREAS the Parties recognize that effective policing services require mutual assistance and operational co-operation between the various police forces that operate in Quebec, in accordance with their respective mandates and applicable statutes:

**WHEREAS** the KRG is a municipality within the meaning of the *Police Act* (R.S.Q., c. P-13.1) and the KRPF is governed in particular by this statute;

WHEREAS, the KRG, Canada and Quebec have also agreed to specify in a new agreement replacing the existing tripartite agreement, the terms for financing the delivery of police services in the Kativik region, which covers the period from 1st April 2011 to March 31, 2013 (hereinafter called the "Tripartite Agreement").

WHEREAS, in addition to the commitments made under the Tripartite Agreement, KRG and Québec agree to conclude an agreement of additional funding to maintain police services offered in Inuit communities for a period of two years from April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2013.

#### THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The preamble is an integral part of this Agreement.
- 2. This agreement replaces and cancels the Agreement for Additional Funding on the Provision of Police Services 2011-2012.
- 3. The present Agreement shall not modify in anyway the tripartite agreement. All provisions of this tripartite agreement shall apply to the present Agreement.
- 4. Quebec agrees to provide an annual contribution of \$859,944 for fiscal years 2011-2012 and 2012-2013, as additional funding to funding provided in Tripartite Agreement for the delivery of police services.
- 5. For For each fiscal year covered by this agreement, Quebec shall pay annually to the ARK's additional contribution provided under section 4 of this Agreement based on the following terms:
  - In four equal instalments on June 1st, August 1st, November 1st, and February 1<sup>st</sup> of each fiscal year covered by this Agreement.
- 6. The parties agree that the complementary contribution includes the amount provided in the Agreement on the Funding of the Construction of Police Stations in the Northern Villages of Puvirnituq, Akulivik, Kangiqsualujjuaq, Umiujaq, Quaqtaq, Ivujivik (2002). Québec will continue to pay the amounts scheduled in that agreement according to the terms. The sums of that agreement will be deducted from the sums of the complementary contribution.
- 7. The parties agree that in the case of an additional financial contribution from the federal government in the scope of a tripartite agreement on the provision of

policing services, Québec will deduct the equivalent amounts from the present agreement to respect the contribution ration provided in the tripartite agreement which will have the effect to modify the present agreement.

- 8. Québec's contribution of funds for the provision of policing services is subject to the appropriation of resources by the Quebec National Assembly.
- 9. The present Agreement comes into force on the date of signature by all parties and covers the period from April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011 to March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2013.
