The Assembly was called to order at 9.46 o'clock a.m.

ROUTINE PROCEEDINGS

Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, moved that Private Bill 210 be referred for consultations and clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources and that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food be a member during its deliberations in respect of the said Bill.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and in pursuance of Standing Order 146, Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT within the framework of the examination of Bill 48, An Act concerning the environmental inspection of motor vehicles, the Committee on Transportation and the Environment hold special consultations and public hearings on 14 and 15 May 2012, and that, for this purpose, it hear the following groups:

A period of 15 minutes shall be allotted for the opening statements, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

The presentation by each group shall last no more than 10 minutes and the exchange with the members of the Committee shall last no more than 35 minutes, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition; A period of 15 minutes shall be allotted for the closing statements, which time shall be shared equally among the members of the parliamentary group forming the Government and the Members sitting in opposition;

The Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Parks shall be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

The motion was carried.

Business Having Precedence

Estimates of Expenditure

The Assembly entered upon the limited debate on the reports from the committees that considered the estimates of expenditure of the departments for the fiscal year ending on 31 March 2013.

After a meeting held with the House leaders of the parliamentary groups, Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time within the framework of this limited debate: 16 minutes shall be granted to the independent Members who wish to be heard, subject to a maximum of five minutes per Member; the rest of the time set aside for this debate shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government will be transferred to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and vice versa. Finally, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Houda-Pepin, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Estimates of Expenditure

The Assembly continued the limited debate on the reports from the committees that considered the estimates of expenditure of the departments for the fiscal year ending on 31 March 2013.

The debate being concluded and the Assembly having disposed of the motions stating a grievance and the motion by the Minister of Finance moved within the framework of the Budget Speech, the question was put for concurrence in the reports from the committees that considered the estimates of expenditure of the several departments for the fiscal year ending on 31 March 2013; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

Appropriation Bills

Mrs. Courchesne, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved that Bill 66, Appropriation Act No. 2, 2012-2013, be brought before the Assembly, that this Bill do pass in principle, and that this Bill do pass; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

This motion was carried on division.

Accordingly, Bill 66, Appropriation Act No. 2, 2012-2013, was passed.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mrs. Malavoy (Taillon) moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to appoint a mediator in its dispute with the students.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be set aside for the reply by the mover of this motion; 5 minutes 30 seconds shall be granted to the independent Members who wish to be heard; the rest of the time set aside for this debate shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government will be transferred to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; and any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government will be transferred to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, and vice versa. Finally, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Government Bills

Passage

Mrs. Courchesne, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the passage of Bill 58, An Act to amend the Act respecting the Pension Plan of Management Personnel and other legislative provisions. After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 58 was passed.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Lessard, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy, moved, –That Bill 4, An Act to allow municipalities to grant a tax credit to certain owners of residential immovables affected by a significantly higher than average increase in value, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Bergeron (Verchères).

At 5.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 3 May 2012, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.
