Business Having Precedence

Want of Confidence Motion

The debate arose thereon.

Mrs. Marois, Leader of the Official Opposition, moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec withdraw its confidence from the Liberal Government and its Premier for having ignored the repeated requests to open a public inquiry into all of the revelations relating to corruption and collusion, for its refusal to establish a true royalty regime to enrich Québec, for its disastrous management of the current student crisis, for having failed to eliminate healthcare wait times and for its lack of leadership before the federal Government.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Ouimet, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 20 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for her reply; 26 minutes 30 seconds shall be allotted to the independent Members who wish to be heard, subject to a maximum of 10 minutes per Member; the rest of the time set aside for this debate shall be shared equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, which is approximately 1 hour 25 minutes for each parliamentary group. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members shall be redistributed equally between the parliamentary group forming the Government and the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; any time not used by the parliamentary group forming the Government shall go to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition and vice versa. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.
