Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Ferland (Ungava), together with Mr. Kelley, Minister responsible for Aboriginal Affairs, Mr. Curzi (Borduas), Mr. Deltell (Chauveau) and Mrs. Lapointe (Crémazie), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark this year the onehundredth anniversary of the cessation of the district of Ungava by the Government of Canada and its integration into the territory of Québec; THAT it underline the size and beauty of its expanse, the strength of its inhabitants, and that it recall that Ungava's economic development must first and foremost be made for the benefit of the communities that proudly live there.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Institutions, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 75, An Act respecting certain powers of inspection and seizure;
- the Committee on Transportation and the Environment, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 57, An Act to modify the rules governing the use of photo radar devices and red light camera systems and amend other legislative provisions;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 74, An Act to prevent skin cancer caused by artificial tanning;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 69, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs;
- the Committee on Public Finance, to give clause-by-clause consideration to Bill 73, An Act respecting mainly the implementation of certain provisions of the Budget Speech of 20 March 2012.

And, by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, he convened the following Committee:

the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 14, An Act respecting the development of mineral resources in keeping with the principles of sustainable development, and of Bill 27, An Act respecting the Société du Plan Nord; and to hold public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 51, An Act to amend the Animal Health Protection Act mainly in regard to animal safety and welfare.

Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to decide whether it will examine certain petitions;
- the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to organize its proceedings, to examine the annual management reports of departments and public bodies, pursuant to the provisions of the *Public Administration Act*, and to examine the financial commitments of departments and public bodies.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 298, Mr. Gendron, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that the interpellation between Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean) and Mrs. Boulet, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, on "the improvement of Quebecers' living conditions", and scheduled for Friday, 18 May 2012, then deferred until Friday, 25 May 2012, owing to the holding of an extraordinary sitting, will be held on Monday, 28 May 2012, from 2.00 o'clock p.m. to 4.00 o'clock p.m.

He then informed the Assembly that on Friday, 1 June 2012, Mr. Aussant (Nicolet-Yamaska) would question Mr. Bachand, Minister of Finance, during an interpellation on "the economic costs for Québec as a province of Canada".

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 236, Mr. Corbeil, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, moved, —That Bill 51, An Act to amend the Animal Health Protection Act mainly in regard to animal safety and welfare, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 51 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Gautrin, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 51 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources.
