Motions Without Notice

Mr. Hamad (Louis-Hébert), together with Mr. Dubé (Lévis), moved a motion concerning the 2013-2014 budget; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie), together with Mr. Drolet (Jean-Lesage) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion concerning the specific tax on alcoholic beverages; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, moved a motion concerning a mandate to the Committee on Labour and the Economy; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, together with Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Dubé (Lévis) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the 10th anniversary of the Commission des relations du travail. Its creation, on 25 November 2002, represents a major turning point as regards individual and collective labour relations. It must be pointed out that the Commission addresses ongoing challenges pertaining to the introduction of new skills and that it ensures the diligent and efficient administration of the Labour Code along with some thirty laws falling within its jurisdiction;

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm the importance of the mission of the Commission.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the examination of Bill 10, An Act to provide for the provisional relief from office of an elected municipal officer, the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain hold special consultations next 4 December and that, for this purpose, it hear the following groups:

Union des municipalités du Québec Fédération québécoise des municipalités Commission des droits de la personne et des droits de la jeunesse Directeur des poursuites criminelles et pénales Barreau du Québec Commission municipale du Québec

THAT a period of 12 minutes be set aside for opening statements;

THAT the time set aside for the opening statements by the party forming the Government and by the party forming the Official Opposition be of 5 minutes each and the time set aside for the Second Opposition Group be of 2 minutes;

THAT the presentation of each of the groups last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 50 minutes;

THAT the time set aside for the party forming the Government be of 22 minutes and the time set aside for the opposition Members be of 28 minutes;

THAT a period of 12 minutes be set aside for closing statements allocated in the same manner as for the opening statements;

THAT the Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the examination of Bill 6, An Act concerning the date of coming into force of certain provisions of the Act to eliminate union placement and improve the operation of the construction industry, the Committee on Labour and the Economy hear the Commission de la construction du Québec next 29 November after Routine Proceedings for a period of one hour;

THAT the presentation of each of the groups last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 50 minutes;

THAT the time set aside for the party forming the Government be of 22 minutes and the time set aside for the opposition Members be of 28 minutes;

THAT the Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.
