Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved, —That Bill 11, An Act to amend the Act respecting the National Assembly and the Act respecting the conditions of employment and the pension plan of the Members of the National Assembly, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 11 was accordingly passed in principle.

Committee of the Whole

Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, moved that the Assembly resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole for the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 11, An Act to amend the Act respecting the National Assembly and the Act respecting the conditions of employment and the pension plan of the Members of the National Assembly.

The motion was carried.
Bill 11 was considered in Committee of the Whole and thereupon reported.

Passage

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 230, Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the passage of Bill 11, An Act to amend the Act respecting the National Assembly and the Act respecting the conditions of employment and the pension plan of the Members of the National Assembly.

The motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 11 was passed.

Passage in Principle

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 9 was accordingly passed in principle.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Gaudreault, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy,

moved, —That Bill 8, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 8 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 8 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain.

The motion was carried.
