

Mrs. Boulet (Laviolette), together with Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), moved a motion concerning the budget cuts at the Ministère des Transports; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Dubé (Lévis), together with Mrs. David (Gouin), moved a motion concerning non-budgetary organizations; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Mrs. Daneault (Groulx), moved a motion concerning unbudgeted health sector investments in the five-year capital plan; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David (Gouin), together with Mrs. De Courcy, Minister of Immigration and Cultural Communities, Mrs. Houda-Pepin (La Pinière) and Mr. Duchesneau (Saint-Jérôme), moved:

THAT the National Assembly offers its deepest condolences to the family and friends of Mrs. Louise Laurin;

THAT it recognize this compassionate woman's commitment to the French language, education and the secularization of Québec schools, as well as her determination to make Québec a land of inclusion and openness toward others.

At the invitation of Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a public meeting to examine the annual reports of the Outaouais Health and Social Services Agency; it shall then hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the Committee's observations, conclusions and recommendations following the hearings held within the framework of the examination of the annual management reports of the health and social services agencies;
- the Committee on Institutions shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of taking up certain mandates;

the Committee on Transportation and the Environment shall hold a deliberative meeting to continue organizing its proceedings with respect to the order given by the Assembly aiming to shed light on the events of last 24 October concerning the action taken by the Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment, Wildlife and Parks with regard to the independent public body known as the Bureau d'audiences publiques sur l'environnement (BAPE).

Estimates of Expenditure

Estimates of the National Assembly

On the motion by Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, and pursuant to Standing Order 286, the Assembly resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly for the 2013-2014 fiscal year.

After a meeting held with the House leaders of the parliamentary groups in pursuance of Standing Order 285, Mrs. Poirier, Chair of the Committee of the Whole, informed the committee that the period allotted for the consideration of the estimates shall not exceed two hours and that the speaking time shall be apportioned as follows: 20 minutes shall be allotted to the President for his opening remarks; approximately 45 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 40 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 10 minutes shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 5 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members.

The Committee of the Whole entered upon the consideration of the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly.

The consideration of the estimates of expenditure for the National Assembly being concluded, Mr. Turcotte (Saint-Jean), member of the Committee of the Whole, reported to the Assembly.

At 1.02 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.02 o'clock p.m.

Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that she had received a request for a debate upon adjournment to be held on Thursday, 21 February 2013, on a question by Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier) to Mrs. Marois, Premier, about consultations with the First Nations regarding the cancellation of mini hydro-electric projects.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) moved:

THAT the National Assembly demand that the PQ Government renounce the \$250 million in budget cuts imposed on universities by 2013-2014;

THAT it demand that the Government renounce all means of financing universities that would increase the tax burden on taxpayers and that would constrain business competitiveness, particularly the revision of tax measures to help businesses.

Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 46 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 42 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 16 minutes shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 5 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie) moved:

THAT the motion be amended as follows: by removing, in the second line, the words "and that would constrain business competitiveness, particularly the revision of tax measures to help businesses".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly demand that the PQ Government renounce the \$250 million in budget cuts imposed on universities by 2013-2014;

THAT it demand that the Government renounce all means of financing universities that would increase the tax burden on taxpayers.

The debate continued on the main motion by Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) and on the amendment by Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie), subject to the permission of its author.

Mr. Sklavounos (Laurier-Dorion) refused the amendment proposed by Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:
