(10) Mr. Gautrin (Verdun) – **26 March 2013** To the Chair of the Conseil du trésor:

Section 128 of the *Supplemental Pension Plans Act* (SPP) obliges all pension plans to constitute a provision for adverse deviation, before using an actuarial surplus to improve the plan. This provision is established as a percentage of accrued benefits and according to a formula specified in sections 60.1 to 60.5 of the regulation accompanying the Act.

With the necessary modifications, more particularly as regards solvency, could the Chair of the Conseil du trésor provide us with the percentage of accrued benefits that are necessary to constitute, in the Government and Public Employees Pension Plan (RREGOP), a provision for adverse deviation by applying the method of calculation provided for in sections 60.1 to 60.5 of the Regulation respecting Supplemental Pension Plans?
