The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Léger, Minister of Families, together with Mrs. Gaudreault (Hull), Mr. Ratthé (Blainville) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly express its deepest condolences to the family and friends of Mr. Neil Galliou, who died tragically last Friday, 5 April, at the Racines de vie Montessori day care centre in Gatineau;

THAT it express its full support to the director of the day care centre, Mrs. Nathalie Gagnon, her family and friends, her employees and educators, as well as to the parents and children touched by this tragedy;

THAT it pay tribute to the police authorities, organizations and neighbours who provided support to the children and parents.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

At the invitation of Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Moreau (Châteauguay), together with Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), moved a motion concerning the motion carried unanimously on 28 March 2013 regarding alliances with the other Canadian provinces; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier) moved a motion concerning parliamentarians and accounts in tax havens; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mrs. Hivon, Minister for Social Services and Youth Protection, together with Mrs. Vallée (Gatineau), Mrs. Daneault (Groulx) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark Autism Awareness Month, during which numerous activities are organized throughout Québec under the theme "Let's keep an open mind";

THAT it express solidarity with autistic persons and their families, who each day must show great courage to take up the challenges of difference and integration;

Finally, that the Assembly underline the advocacy, counselling and support work carried out by the numerous community advocates, including the Fédération québécoise de l'autisme, and express its gratitude to all care workers and volunteers who day after day support autistic persons and their families.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mr. Bergman (D'Arcy-McGee), together with Mr. Lisée, Minister of International Relations, La Francophonie and External Trade, Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognizes that, yesterday April 8, 2013, was Yom Hashoah, the International Day of Commemoration for the Victims of the Holocaust.

THAT a period of 15 minutes be set aside for opening statements;

THAT the time set aside for the party forming the Government be of 24 minutes and the time set aside for the opposition Members be of 26 minutes;

THAT a period of 15 minutes be set aside for closing statements allocated in the same manner as for the opening statements;

THAT the Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Pursuant to Standing Order 129, Mr. Lessard, Chief Opposition Whip, moved:

THAT the Member for Beauce-Sud be appointed a permanent member of the Committee on Public Administration in substitution for the Member for Châteauguay;

THAT this modification enter into effect immediately.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 10 April 2013, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate will be held on the motion by Mrs. Vallières (Richmond).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly denounce the Parti Québécois Government's doublespeak, which, on the one hand, decries the reforms affecting employment insurance beneficiaries introduced by the Federal Government without preliminary studies and, on the other hand, attacks social assistance recipients without supporting data and statistics;

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity abandon her draft Regulation to amend the Individual and Family Assistance Regulation, of which certain elements are likely to contravene several provisions of the Charter of Human Rights and Freedoms.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 28 March 2013, on the consideration of the report from the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources, which, on 28 January 2013, examined the five-year review of the state of the forests in the domain of the State and the results achieved in terms of sustainable forest management. The report contains two recommendations.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 21, An Act to optimize government action in delivering public services to citizens and businesses.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

At 4.29 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. St-Arnaud, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

Debates Upon Adjournment

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held two debates upon adjournment:

- the first, on a question by Mrs. Blais (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne) to Mr. Hébert, Minister responsible for Seniors, about the 5000 places awaited in CHSLDs;
- the second, on a question by Mrs. Vallée (Gatineau) to Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, about the \$100 million in cuts that have yet to be identified in health and social services.

Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved the adjournment of the Assembly until Wednesday, 10 April 2013, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, at 6.25 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Wednesday, 10 April 2013, at 9.45 o'clock a.m.
