Introduction of Bills

Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Employment and Social Solidarity, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:

39 Voluntary Retirement Savings Plans Act

Mr. Bonnardel (Granby) moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:

391 An Act to amend the Public Protector Act

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bolduc (Jean-Talon), together with Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, Mrs. Daneault (Groulx) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline Mental Health Week, which is being held from 6 to 12 May under the theme: "Tu es formidable, le sais-tu?";

THAT it remind the population that it is essential to take care of one's mental health along with one's physical health;

And that it recall that we all have an impact on improving and maintaining the mental health of those around us.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), together with Mr. Gaudreault, Minister of Transport, Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Federal Government to reverse its decision to transfer the Québec coast guard training centre to Halifax;

THAT it call upon the Federal Government to take into consideration the concerns of the Commissioner of Official Languages that service in French will not be provided adequately should such a transfer take place.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lelièvre, Minister responsible for the Gaspésie-Îles-de-la-Madeleine region, together with Mrs. Charlebois (Soulanges), Mr. Schneeberger (Drummond-Bois-Francs) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the Government of Québec ask the Federal Government to take the necessary measures to reopen Percé wharf as soon as possible and rectify this unacceptable situation for the tourism industry of the Gaspésie region, particularly for the city of Percé.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David (Gouin), together with Mr. Kotto, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mrs. Ménard (Laporte) and Mrs. Roy (Montarville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize and praise the legacy of Jean Cousineau, committed composer and professor, who passed away on 4 April 2013;

THAT it mark his tremendous contribution to the teaching of violin to Québec children since 1965 by the founding of the Les petits violons school and the creation of Les petits violons ensemble in 1974;

THAT it express its condolences to the family and friends of Jean Cousineau.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the invitation of Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committee:

— the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 17, An Act to amend the Professional Code with respect to disciplinary justice.

Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to prepare the hearing on the administrative management of the Ministère des Finances et de l'Économie; it shall then hold a public meeting to hear the Deputy Minister of the Ministère des Finances et de l'Économie regarding administrative management; and finally, it shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the observations, conclusions and recommendations, if any, following this hearing.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. President heard additional comments from Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, with regard to the request for a directive made at the sitting of 7 May 2013 by Mr. Deltell, Second Opposition Group House Leader, and which he had taken under advisement, concerning the holding of public hearings by the Committee on Public Administration in relation to the mandate of the Committee on the conditions of employment of persons holding senior positions and who are not part of the public service.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 7 May 2013, on the motion by Mrs. De Courcy, Minister responsible for the Charter of the French language, for the passage in principle of Bill 14, An Act to amend the Charter of the French language, the Charter of human rights and freedoms and other legislative provisions.

Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that he had received a request for a debate upon adjournment to be held on Thursday, 9 May 2013, on a question by Mr. Hamad (Louis-Hébert) to Mrs. Zakaïb, Minister for Industrial Policy and the Banque de développement économique du Québec, about the inaction of the Parti Québécois Government to avoid the closing of the Aliments Old Dutch plant in Lachine affecting 216 workers.

The debate continued.

At 1.01 o'clock p.m., Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, in pursuance of Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion by Mrs. De Courcy, Minister responsible for the Charter of the French language, was adjourned.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Bolduc (Jean-Talon) moved:

THAT the Committee on Health and Social Services hold special consultations beginning on Wednesday, 29 May 2013, on the Parti Québécois Government's draft rules repealing the provision that prohibits the sale, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages inside gaming areas and that, for this purpose, the Committee hear the Minister of Minister of Finance and the Economy, the national public health director, the Association des centres de traitement des dépendances du Québec and the Minister of Health and Social Services, as well as any person it may deem necessary to summon;

THAT the presentation by the Minister of Finance and the Economy last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 90 minutes;

THAT the presentation by the national public health director and by the Association des centres de traitement des dépendances du Québec last 10 minutes respectively and that the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 50 minutes respectively;

THAT the presentation by the Minister of Health and Social Services last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 90 minutes;

THAT the presentation by each of the other speakers, if any, last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 50 minutes;

THAT the Committee report to the Assembly no later than 12 June 2013, unless the Committee decides otherwise;

Lastly, that this motion become an order of the Assembly.

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 46 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 42 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 16 minutes shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 5 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
