#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lessard (Lotbinière-Frontenac), together with Mr. Blanchet, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment, Wildlife and Parks, Mr. Marcotte (Portneuf) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark World Environment Day, whose theme this year is "Think.Eat.Save";

THAT the National Assembly salute this anti-food waste and food loss campaign at a time when 1.3 billion tonnes of food are lost or wasted every year, according to UN Food and Agriculture Organization estimates;

THAT the Assembly encourage Quebecers to reduce their environmental footprint and become more aware of the environmental impact of their food choices;

THAT it encourage Quebecers to buy locally to help limit greenhouse gas emissions.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Caire (La Peltrie), together with Mr. Gaudreault, Minister of Transport, and Mrs. Boulet (Laviolette), moved:

#### **Government Bills**
