Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Roy (Arthabaska), together with Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, Mr. Bolduc (Jean-Talon) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly require that the Government acknowledge the serious deficiencies noted by the Auditor General in the delivery of homecare services and that it promptly take the necessary corrective action to ensure that quality services are provided to the most vulnerable of Quebecers.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lelièvre, Minister for Regions, together with Mrs. Charlebois (Soulanges), Mr. Schneeberger (Drummond–Bois-Francs) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec ask the federal government to take the necessary measures to repair the Percé wharf once and for all;

THAT despite the minor repairs planned for this summer, the problem of the Percé wharf remains unresolved and the wharf is still the responsibility of the federal government;

THAT given the vital importance of the wharf for the tourism industry, the federal government be called upon to implement a plan to solve the problem for the long term.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Carrière (Chapleau), together with Mr. Gaudreault, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy, Mr. Spénard (Beauce-Nord) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the Semaine de la municipalité, held from June 2 to 8, 2013 under the theme "together for active communities!";

THAT it recognize the key role of municipalities in the development, occupancy and vitality of territories throughout Québec;

THAT it congratulate the municipalities for their various efforts to forge closer ties with their citizens through community-building actions or activities.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Khadir (Mercier), together with Mr. Lisée, Minister of International Relations, La Francophonie and External Trade, Mrs. St-Pierre (Acadie) and Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec, a few days ahead of the presidential election in Iran, which it hopes will comply with democratic practices, and in solidarity with prisoners of conscience throughout the world, condemn the massacre of thousands of political prisoners in Iran in the summer of 1988.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mr. Blanchet, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment, Wildlife and Parks, together with Mr. Lessard (Lotbinière-Frontenac), Mr. Marcotte (Portneuf) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec mark the Semaine du fleuve Saint-Laurent, which will run from June 7 to 15, 2013;

THAT it highlight the goal of the week, which is to raise awareness among Quebecers about the environmental, economic and cultural importance of the St-Lawrence River, a majestic natural treasure:

THAT the National Assembly call attention to the historical importance of the St-Lawrence as a waterway for the First Nations and the founders of the Québec nation;

THAT it invite Quebecers to celebrate the week by taking part in family activities on the shores of this great river, which lies at the very heart of Québec's identity.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Mr. D'Amour (Rivière-du-Loup-Témiscouata), together with Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. Schneeberger (Drummond-Bois-Francs) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 7th edition of the Journée de la Gaspésie et des Îles-de-la-Madeleine held today, June 6, on the theme "Mangeons bleu" (eat blue);

THAT it salute the initiative of the Gaspésie and Îles-dela-Madeleine youth commission in giving the people of the coast and the islands, whether they were born there, adopted the region as their own, fell in love with it or married into it, this opportunity to proudly wear blue to show their sense of belonging to a region of unique potential.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold deliberative meetings to organize the order of initiative on the living conditions of adults staying in residential and long-term care centres; and to establish the observations, conclusions and recommendations, if any, of the Committee report within the framework of the order of reference on the draft rules repealing the provision that prohibits the sale, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages inside gaming areas.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, handed down a ruling following a question posed by the Official Opposition House Leader during the 4 June 2013 sitting, concerning the carrying out by the Committee on Public Finance of the mandate conferred on it by Standing Order 292.

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

The mandate provided for in Standing Order 292 is one that the Committee on Public Finance may take up on its own initiative and for which it may organize proceedings as it sees fit.

Therefore, the Committee has a free hand in carrying out the mandate. It is up to the Committee Chair to call, organize and preside over one or more deliberative meetings, as needed, so that the Committee may decide how the mandate is to be organized. Since Standing Order 292 provides that one meeting must be devoted to the mandate in each fiscal quarter and since the quarter ends on 30 June, there is nothing to indicate at this point that it is impossible for the Committee to carry out the mandate.

For these reasons, the Chair invites the members of the Committee and the Committee Chair to see to it that the mandate provided for in Standing Order 292 is carried out and to use all possible means so that this may be achieved by the end of the quarter.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. St-Arnaud, Minister of Justice and Minister responsible for the administration of legislation respecting the professions, moved the passage of Bill 17, An Act to amend the Professional Code with respect to disciplinary justice.

A debate arose thereon.

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Passage

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion by Mr. St-Arnaud, Minister of Justice and Minister responsible for the administration of legislation respecting the professions, for the passage of Bill 17, An Act to amend the Professional Code with respect to disciplinary justice.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 17 was passed.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 5 June 2013, on the motion by Mr. Gaudreault, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy, for the passage in principle of Bill 27, Social Economy Act.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 27 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 27 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain.
