Motions Without Notice

Pursuant to Standing Order 26.1, Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, in order to permit the introduction of Bill 54, An Act respecting the resumption of work in the construction industry, as well as to carry out all of the stages of its consideration, the Assembly appoint the hours of meeting as follows:

The Assembly shall be permitted to sit every day, beginning at 9.45 o'clock a.m., until it has completed the examination of the matter for which it was summoned or until it decides to adjourn its proceedings.

Pursuant to Standing Order 26.1, Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, in order to permit the introduction of Bill 54, An Act respecting the resumption of work in the construction industry, as well as to carry out all of the stages of its consideration, the Assembly establish the exceptional legislative procedure as provided for in Standing Orders 182 to 184.2 and 257.1 to 257.10;

The President shall be permitted to suspend the proceedings at any time during the sitting, at the request of a Minister or a Deputy Government House Leader.

At 11.05 o'clock a.m., Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings to allow the Members to examine the text of the motions presented by Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader.

The proceedings resumed at 11.26 o'clock a.m.

Mr. Moreau, Official Opposition House Leader, Mr. Deltell, Second Opposition Group House Leader, and Mr. Khadir (Mercier) made comments regarding the motions moved by Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader.

At 11.31 o'clock a.m., Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings to allow the Members to examine Bill 54, An Act respecting the resumption of work in the construction industry.

The proceedings resumed at 1.40 o'clock p.m.

Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that the motions moved by Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, were admissible.

Limited Debate

Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate on the causes for which the Assembly has been summoned for extraordinary sittings and on both motions moved by the Government House Leader, namely the motion to appoint the times during which the Assembly shall meet and the motion to introduce an exceptional procedure: 50 minutes 29 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 46 minutes 45 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 17 minutes 46 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 5 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion to appoint the hours during which the Assembly shall meet; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

Introduction of Bills

Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Labour, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following Bill:

An Act respecting the resumption of work in the construction industry

The motion was carried on division.

Accordingly, Bill 54 was introduced in the Assembly.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Labour, moved, —That Bill 54, An Act respecting the resumption of work in the construction industry, do now pass in principle.

Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 2 hours 7 minutes 19 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 1 hour 57 minutes 53 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 44 minutes 48 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 10 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 54 was passed in principle.

At 7.30 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

Committee of the Whole
Pursuant to the order adopted previously, the Assembly resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole for the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 54, An Act respecting the resumption of work in the construction industry.
Bill 54 was considered in Committee of the Whole, amended and thereupon reported.
At 11.38 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Bédard, Government House Leader, Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings.
Monday, 1 July 2013
The proceedings resumed at 12.05 o'clock a.m.
Report Stage
The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee of the Whole on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 54, An Act respecting the resumption of work in the construction industry.

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The report was concurred in.

Passage

Mrs. Maltais, Minister of Labour, moved the passage of Bill 54, An Act respecting the resumption of work in the construction industry.

Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 25 minutes 28 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 23 minutes 35 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 8 minutes 58 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 2 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 54 was passed.

At 12.34 o'clock a.m., the Assembly having completed the examination of the matter for which it was summoned, Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 17 September 2013, at 1.45 o'clock p.m.
