Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. St-Pierre (Acadie), together with Mr. Kotto, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mrs. Roy (Montarville), Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mr. Ratthé (Blainville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the 17th edition of the Journées de la culture;

THAT it invite Quebecers to take part in large numbers in the thousands of proposed cultural activities and;

THAT the State reiterate its support to the creation, production, dissemination and outreach of Québec culture worldwide.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

THAT the National Assembly of Québec ask the Egyptian Government to make every effort to ensure security and respect for the basic human rights of Canadians Tarek Loubani and John Greyson, particularly by releasing them forthwith.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 17 September 2013, on the hoist motion moved by Mrs. Charlebois (Soulanges) during the debate on the passage in principle of Bill 33, An Act to amend the Act respecting the conditions of employment and the pension plan of the Members of the National Assembly.

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, interrupted the debate to inform the Assembly that he had received a request for a debate upon adjournment to be held on Thursday, 26 September 2013, on a question by Mrs. Houda-Pepin (La Pinière) to Mr. Lisée, Minister responsible for the Montréal region, about the cutbacks in infrastructures by the Parti Québécois that will make taxpayers pay for the extension of the blue line.

The debate continued on the hoist motion by Mrs. Charlebois (Soulanges).

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, in pursuance of Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion by Mrs. Charlebois (Soulanges) was adjourned.

The proceedings resumed at 3.04 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mrs. Gaudreault (Hull) moved:

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm the independence of the Conseil du statut de la femme and call upon the Parti Québécois Government to suspend the four recent appointments.

Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for her reply; approximately 46 minutes 48 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 41 minutes 36 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 15 minutes 36 seconds shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:
