Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Fournier, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mrs. Marois, Premier, Mr. Legault, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mrs. David (Gouin) and Mr. Ratthé (Blainville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly pay tribute to Mr. Paul Desmarais and express its deepest condolences to his family and loved ones;

THAT it recognize his contribution to Montréal and Québec's outreach, as well as his community, artistic and philanthropic involvement.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the invitation of Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Mr. Bonnardel (Granby), together with Mr. Khadir (Mercier) and Mr. Ratthé (Blainville), moved a motion concerning the information given by Hydro-Québec with regard to the power failures of 3 and 4 July 2013 in Northern Québec; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Mr. Bolduc (Jean-Talon), Mrs. Daneault (Groulx) and Mr. Ratthé (Blainville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline Mental Illness Awareness Week, which is held this year from 6 to 12 October 2013:

THAT it take the opportunity to affirm its solidarity with persons suffering from mental illness and who often must face prejudice and stigma;

THAT it also commend the often outstanding work carried out by staff of the health and social services network, working with these people;

Finally, that it express its full support to the families and friends who must each day live with the mental illness of a family member or of someone in their close circle.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Culture and Education, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 45, An Act respecting the Ministère de l'Enseignement supérieur, de la Recherche, de la Science et de la Technologie;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 28, An Act to establish the new Code of Civil Procedure;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 52, An Act respecting end-of-life care.

Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to prepare the hearing on government interventions in the mining sector; it shall then hold a public meeting to hear the Ministère des Ressources naturelles; and, finally, it shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the observations, conclusions and recommendations, if any, following this hearing.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Gaudreault, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy, moved the passage of Bill 27, Social Economy Act.

A debate arose thereon.

Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, interrupted the debate to inform the Assembly that he had received a request for a debate upon adjournment to be held on Thursday, 10 October 2013, on a question by Mrs. Houda-Pepin (La Pinière) to Mr. Gaudreault, Minister of Transport, about the shortfall of \$2 to \$3 billion for the maintenance of the Montréal metro.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 8 October 2013, on the motion by Mrs. Ouellet, Minister of Natural Resources, for the passage in principle of Bill 43, Mining Act.

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, in pursuance of Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion by Mrs. Ouellet, Minister of Natural Resources, was adjourned.

The proceedings resumed at 3.02 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Paradis (Brome-Missisquoi) moved:

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Parti Québécois Government act on the will expressed by the Premier on 31 October 2012, concerning the publishing, one month before the election is called, of an unbiased picture of public finance.

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 44 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 39 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 14 minutes 45 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.
