Deferred Divisions

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services, together with Mr. Bolduc (Jean-Talon), Mr. Lévesque (Vanier-Les Rivières), Mrs. David (Gouin) and Mr. Ratthé (Blainville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly use International Men's Day, held each year on 19 November, to recognize the essential work carried out by organizations for men's health and wellness and for men experiencing difficult circumstances;

THAT it pay tribute to the professionals and volunteers who support these organizations on a daily basis;

THAT it reaffirm the importance of prevention and the promotion of men's health and wellness.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Hamad (Louis-Hébert), together with Mrs. Zakaïb, Minister for Industrial Policy and the Banque de développement économique du Québec, Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie), Mrs. David (Gouin) and Mr. Ratthé (Blainville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly congratulate the businesses that were awarded the Grands Prix québécois de la qualité 2013 on 14 November 2013;

THAT it underline the quality of our entrepreneurial elite;

THAT, lastly, it recognize the talent and vision of Québec entrepreneurs who make up our economic fabric.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Dubé (Lévis) moved a motion concerning SNC-Lavalin's bidding on public contracts; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. David (Gouin), together with Mrs. Maltais, Minister responsible for the Status of Women, Mrs. Gaudreault (Hull), Mrs. Trudel (Charlesbourg) and Mr. Ratthé (Blainville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec pay tribute to the thousand women who took part in the Forum des États généraux de l'action et de l'analyse féministes, held from 14 to 17 November 2013, and congratulate the participants for their rigorous work, within a democratic framework, which will guide feminists for years to come;

THAT the National Assembly firmly reiterate that in our society any act of intimidation or violence toward lesbians and gays is unacceptable and that, in this respect, all political parties denounce the lesbophobic attack of which several women participating in the États généraux were victims in the streets of Montréal last Saturday.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT, within the framework of the examination of Bill 64, An Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning municipal affairs, the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain hold special consultations and public hearings on 26 and 27 November 2013, and that, for this purpose, it hear the following groups:

THAT a period of 15 minutes be set aside for opening statements;

THAT the time set aside for the opening statements by the party forming the Government and by the party forming the Official Opposition be of 6 minutes each and the time set aside for the Second Opposition Group be of 3 minutes; THAT the presentation by each of the groups last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 50 minutes;

THAT the time set aside for the party forming the Government be of 24 minutes and the time set aside for the opposition Members be of 26 minutes;

THAT a period of 15 minutes be set aside for closing statements allocated in the same manner as for the opening statements;

THAT the Minister for Regions be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on the document entitled "Autonomy for All: White Paper on the Creation of Autonomy Insurance".

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, gave the following notice:

— the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the timeline of the order of initiative on the living conditions of adults staying in residential and long-term care centres.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 20 November 2013, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate will be held on the motion by Mr. Paradis (Brome-Missisquoi).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT, on the occasion of the first anniversary of the budget of the Minister of Finance and the Economy and of his commitment to restore budget balance this year, the National Assembly demand that the Parti Québécois Government formally undertake to present a plan to restore budget balance when the Minister of Finance and the Economy tables the next economic update.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 21, 298 and 299, he then informed the Assembly that the interpellation scheduled for Friday, 22 November 2013 between Mr. Billette (Huntingdon) and Mr. Gendron, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, on "the Parti Québécois Government's inaction with regard to agriculture in Québec", will be held on Thursday, 28 November 2013, from 1.00 o'clock p.m. to 3.00 o'clock p.m.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance, which, on 4 November 2013, heard the Auditor General of Québec regarding his desire to implement the order given by the National Assembly on 24 September 2013, following the adoption of a motion instructing him to analyze the economic update that will be presented by the Minister of Finance and the Economy in respect of 2013-2014. The report contains one recommendation.

Mr. Ouimet, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 51 minutes 18 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 45 minutes 36 seconds shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 17 minutes 6 seconds shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 6 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 14 November 2013, on the motion by Mr. Blanchet, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment, Wildlife and Parks, for the passage in principle of Bill 37, An Act to prohibit certain shale natural gas exploration and production activities.
