By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Ménard (Laporte), together with Mr. Bédard, Minister responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, Mr. Drainville, Minister responsible for Democratic Institutions and Active Citizenship, Mr. Picard (Chutes-de-la-Chaudière), Mrs. David (Gouin) and Mr. Ratthé (Blainville), moved:

THAT the Minister for Justice be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following Committees:

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 20 November 2013, on the motion by Mr. Blanchet, Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment, Wildlife and Parks, for the passage in principle of Bill 37, An Act to prohibit certain shale natural gas exploration and production activities.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

At 12.39 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 6.02 o'clock p.m.

Debates Upon Adjournment

The Assembly held two debates upon adjournment:

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- the first, on a question by Mr. Bolduc (Jean-Talon) to Mr. Hébert, Minister of Health and Social Services and Minister responsible for Seniors, about the comments made by Mr. Claude Castonguay concerning the proposed autonomy insurance;
- the second, on a question by Mrs. Weil (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce) to Mrs. Malavoy, Minister of Education, Recreation and Sports, about the calling of Bill 496, An Act to prevent and reduce the consequences of head injuries and concussions in students participating in school sports activities, for consideration.

At 6.27 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 26 November 2013, at 1.45 o'clock p.m.
