Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Paradis (Brome-Missisquoi), together with Mr. Marceau, Minister of Finance and the Economy, Mr. Dubé (Lévis), Mr. Khadir (Mercier), Mr. Ratthé (Blainville) and Mrs. Houda-Pepin (La Pinière), moved:

THAT the Committee on Public Finance hear the Auditor General of Québec for a period of three hours on Tuesday, 11 March 2014, following the tabling of his analysis report on the Government's economic update of November 2013.

The question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie), together with Mr. Bergeron, Minister of Public Security, Mr. Pelletier (Rimouski), Mr. Carrière (Chapleau), Mr. Ratthé (Blainville) and Mrs. Houda-Pepin (La Pinière), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark Convenience Store Day by applauding the deserving service carried out each day by the 50,000 owners, managers and employees of the 6000 convenience stores of Québec, who make up a great industry and who wish to have their regulations lightened and modernized to create even more growth, jobs and wealth throughout Québec.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier) moved a motion concerning the modernization of the legislative framework governing oil and gas exploration and development for the protection of drinking water sources by municipalities; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on the living conditions of adults staying in residential and long-term care centres;
- the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting to prepare the hearing on the administrative management and governance of the Centre hospitalier de l'université de Montréal; it shall then hold a public meeting to hear the Centre hospitalier de l'université de Montréal; and finally, it shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the observations, conclusions and recommendations following this hearing.

Government Bills

Report Stage

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 18 February 2014, on the consideration of the report from the Committee on Health and Social Services on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 52, An Act respecting end-of-life care.

The debate being concluded, the report was concurred in.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Institutions on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 28, An Act to establish the new Code of Civil Procedure.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Poirier, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, in pursuance of Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion by Mr. St-Arnaud, Minister of Justice, was adjourned.

The proceedings resumed at 3.04 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie) moved:

THAT the Committee on Public Finance shed light on the circumstances surrounding the \$2,999,999.70 investment in July 2008 by the FTQ Solidarity Fund in Capital BLF and that, for this purpose, the Committee hear the former president and chief executive officer of Capital BLF, Mr. Claude Blanchet, as well as any person it may deem necessary to summon;

THAT the presentation by Mr. Claude Blanchet last no longer than 15 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 3 hours;

THAT the presentation by each of the other speakers, if any, last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 80 minutes;

THAT the Committee report to the Assembly no later than 18 March 2014, unless the Committee decides otherwise;

Lastly, that this motion become an order of the Assembly.

Following a meeting with the House leaders, Mr. Cousineau, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this motion: 10 minutes shall be allotted to the mover of the motion for his reply; approximately 36 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Government; approximately 24 minutes shall be allotted to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; approximately 33 minutes shall be allotted to the Second Opposition Group; and 7 minutes shall be allotted to the independent Members. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by any of the parliamentary groups shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in proportion to their representation in the Assembly. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

At the end of her address, Mrs. Thériault (Anjou-Louis-Riel) moved:

THAT the motion by the Member for La Prairie be amended as follows: In the fourth line, insert the words "the Premier," after the word "hear";

After the first paragraph, insert the following paragraph: "THAT the presentation by the Premier last no longer than 15 minutes and the exchanges with the Committee members last no longer than 3 hours;".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the Committee report to the Assembly no later than 18 March 2014, unless the Committee decides otherwise;

Lastly, that this motion become an order of the Assembly.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie) accepted the amendment proposed by Mrs. Thériault (Anjou–Louis-Riel).

The debate continued on the main motion by Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie) and on the amendment by Mrs. Thériault (Anjou–Louis-Riel).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the amendment motion by Mrs. Thériault (Anjou–Louis-Riel); a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Traversy, Deputy Government House Leader, the divisions on the amendment by Mrs. Thériault (Anjou–Louis-Riel) and on the motion by Mr. Le Bouyonnec (La Prairie) were deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.
