Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Bédard, Leader of the Official Opposition, tabled the following:

An excerpt of the report by the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources on the acceptability, for Québec, of the project proposed by Enbridge Pipelines Inc. to reverse the flow of Pipeline 9B eastward between North Westover and Montréal described in the document entitled "Inversion du flux de l'oléoduc 9B d'Enbridge", which includes the Committee's observations, recommendations and conclusions, dated December 2013.

At the request of Mr. President, Mr. Khadir (Mercier) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred during the 24 September 2014 sitting, on the motion moved by Mr. Lisée (Rosemont), together with Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection and Public Health, Mr. Surprenant (Groulx) and Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly speak out against tightening the rules governing the Homelessness Partnering Strategy and the intention of the Federal Government to support only projects based on the "Housing First" approach, which would have the serious consequence of denying funding to many organizations that support various projects fighting homelessness;

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Federal Government respect Québec's jurisdiction and the policy directions announced in the Politique nationale de lutte à l'itinérance, Québec's national policy to fight homelessness, adopted in February 2014;

THAT it demand that the Federal Government renew the Homelessness Partnering Strategy under the same terms, namely by respecting Québec's policy directions and priorities in this area.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Martel (Nicolet-Bécancour), together with Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), moved a motion to hear the Minister of Sustainable Development, the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change on issuing certificates of authorization for drilling at Cacouna; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lisée (Rosemont), together with Mrs. Charlebois, Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection and Public Health, Mr. Schneeberger (Drummond–Bois-Francs) and Mrs. David (Gouin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to revise the Tobacco Act without delay to prevent initiation to smoking and reduce the prevalence of smoking.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion concerning the negotiation process of the Minister of Health and Social Services and the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

— the Committee on Public Administration shall hold a deliberative meeting for the purpose of meeting the Auditor General of Québec and organizing the Committee's proceedings.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 24 September 2014, on the motion by Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, moving that Bill 3, An Act to foster the financial health and sustainability of municipal defined benefit pension plans, do now pass in principle.

At 12.48 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Fournier, Government House Leader, and by leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, Mr. Ouimet, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.03 o'clock p.m.

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion by Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, moving that Bill 3, An Act to foster the financial health and sustainability of municipal defined benefit pension plans, do now pass in principle.
