#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Bergeron (Verchères), together with Mrs. Roy (Montarville) and Mr. Khadir (Mercier), moved a motion concerning the Unité permanente anticorruption (UPAC); this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Surprenant (Groulx), together with Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), moved a motion concerning the awarding and management of public contracts in the information technologies and communications industry; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Thériault, Minister of Public Security, together with Mr. Bergeron (Verchères) and Mrs. Roy (Montarville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly remind Quebecers of the importance of providing the information they have to the authorities and cooperating in UPAC investigations.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), together with Mrs. David, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mrs. Hivon (Joliette) and Mrs. Samson (Iberville), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the vital role Société Radio-Canada plays in providing news coverage, cultural content and entertainment to Québec francophones and 2.6 million francophones and francophiles outside Québec;

THAT the National Assembly affirm that the current cutbacks in Société Radio-Canada's French-language services are causing significant concern in Québec and across Canada;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate the desirability of having a strong francophone public broadcaster and the importance of regional news;

THAT the National Assembly urge the Federal Government to support Société Radio-Canada in carrying out its mandate and give it the means needed to meet its obligations under federal legislation.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to hear the interested parties and give clause-by-clause consideration to the following private bills, in the order indicated hereafter: Bill 200, An Act respecting Municipalité de Lac-Simon; Bill 201, An Act respecting Ville de Westmount; and Bill 202, An Act respecting the Régie intermunicipale de valorisation des matières organiques de Beauharnois-Salaberry et de Roussillon;
- the Committee on Culture and Education, to hear the interested parties and give clause-by-clause consideration to Private Bill 203, An Act respecting the sale of an immovable situated on the La Grave heritage site.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

Mr. Moreau, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy, moved that Bill 23, An Act to amend the Charter of Ville de Montréal as concerns the composition of the executive committee, do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 23 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Sklavounos, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 23 be referred for clause-by-clause consideration to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain.

The motion was carried.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 25 November 2014, on the hoist motion moved by Mr. Pagé (Labelle) during the debate on the passage in principle of Bill 10, An Act to modify the organization and governance of the health and social services network, in particular by abolishing the regional agencies.

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At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.04 o'clock p.m.

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The Assembly continued the debate on the hoist motion moved by Mr. Pagé (Labelle) during the debate on the passage in principle of Bill 10, An Act to modify the organization and governance of the health and social services network, in particular by abolishing the regional agencies.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:
