AN ACT RESPECTING VILLE DE TERREBONNE

WHEREAS it is in the interest of Ville de Terrebonne that it be granted certain powers;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS :

1. Ville de Terrebonne may, by by-law, prescribe for the part of its territory described in the schedule, according to the categories it determines, the maximum number of establishments in which alcoholic beverages are sold for consumption on the premises.

2. Notwithstanding the first paragraph of section 59 of the Act respecting liquor permits (R.S.Q., chapter P-9.1), the council may, by by-law, fix 1:00 a.m. as the time at which the selling or serving of alcoholic beverages under a bar permit must cease in the part of the territory indicated in the schedule.

3. A revised planning program must be adopted as provided in the first paragraph of section 110.3.1 of the Act respecting land use planning and development (R.S.Q., chapter A-19.1) not later than 31 December 2004.

The third paragraph of section 136.0.1 of that Act applies with respect to the by-laws adopted under section 25 of Order in Council 736-2001 dated 20 June 2001, with the necessary modifications.

4. Section 28 of Order in Council 736-2001 dated 20 June 2001 respecting the amalgamation of the towns of Lachenaie, La Plaine and Terrebonne is amended by striking out “and until the second general election” in the first and second lines of the first paragraph.

5. This Act comes into force on *(insert here the date of assent to this Act)*.

SCHEDULE

A territory being part of Ville de Terrebonne, bounded on the north by Saint-Louis street, on the east by Chapleau street, on the south by the Rivière des Mille-Îles and on the west by des Braves street and its extension to the Rivière des Mille-Îles.
